

Man cleared of child abuse by California

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The California attorney general's office cleared Tony Alamo of accusations of child abuse, which Alamo called "harassment and prejudice against Christianity."

Investigators found no evidence to support claims by two Arkansas men that Alamo and his followers at the Tony and Susan Alamo Foundation in Saugus, Calif., had abused their sons, according to Myron Jenkins, a deputy attorney general with the San Fernando Valley district office.
