
Tony Alamo has been wrongly incarcerated for over four years because the IRS threatened and hired witnesses to lie in order to create a case against him.

She said she had confidential information and couldn't talk over the phone, and wanted me to meet with her.

Kathy Bolpa and I met Birgitta for lunch at a restaurant on Sunset strip in West Hollywood. Birgitta said the IRS told her if she did not cooperate and falsely testify against Tony Alamo that she would be audited, they would impose huge fines on her, destroy her Hollywood fashion designing business that she loved, which included boutiques in Beverly Hills and on Sunset Strip, and deport her, taking away her \$3 million home in warm, sunny Pacific Palisades over-looking the Pacific ocean which she adored, along with her Rolls Royce, Mercedes Benz, and many other assets that she acquired well before ever meeting Tony Alamo.

Birgitta testified in court that Tony gave her \$45,000 a month for about one year. That comes to over a half million dollars! I've worked in our church office for years and I know our church never took in that kind of money. It took around \$45,000 a month just for us to pay our own bills. Where are Birgitta's receipts for the money? Why didn't she pay taxes on it? It's because she never received it. I can plainly see that Birgitta chose to lie for the government for her own self-preservation.
